DROP FOR NON-PAYMENT POLICY

Enrollment fees must be paid IN FULL within 3 calendar days of registration or all of your classes may be dropped and released to other students. In addition to the 3-day non-payment drop policy, **there is a final outstanding balance drop date.** No balance will be carried over into the start of the semester. **All fees (enrollment and health fees) must be paid in full by the Friday (midnight) before the start of the semester.** If there is a balance on your account, your classes will be dropped the next morning (Saturday) regardless of when you registered. There will be no drops for nonpayment processed once the semester begins. If you need assistance paying your enrollment fees and would like to apply for a Fee Waiver, go to

It is your responsibility to check your account balance and pay the amount owed.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY TO DROP CLASSES

To avoid a "W" grade, students must drop classes on or before the day of first class meeting. **Students will not be automatically dropped for non-attendance. You must drop online.** Anytime after the first class meeting, you will not be eliqible to receive a refund for your classes nor be exempt from payment.

WAIT LIST POLICY

You are not able to wait list more than one section per course. You cannot wait list a course that will conflict with another course. As seats become available, students will be moved into an open seat. You will be notified by email (it is your responsibility to make sure that your e-mail is up-to-date) and have 3 calendar days to pay for the course or you may be dropped. If your name remains on the wait list, you must attend the first class meeting and obtain the instructor's approval to add the course (Log in to Self-Service often to check your status on the wait list).

NOTE: Please check that your email address is current in your student profile via Self-Service.

PAY FEES IMMEDIATELY

Fees must be paid within 3 calendar days of registering for courses or you may be dropped for non-payment. The date that you register counts as the first calendar day.

CLASS INSTRUCTION METHODS



Online (O)

FULLY ONLINE INSTRUCTION (0) classes are distance education classes that meet 100% online with no scheduled meeting days. Students logon to Canvas at **sac.edu/Canvas** and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.



Fully Online Live (OL) **FULLY ONLINE LIVE INSTRUCTION (OL)** classes are distance education classes that only meet in scheduled live streaming Zoom meetings. Students logon to Canvas at **sac.edu/Canvas** to attend class virtually on zoom during the published course times. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.



Virtual Hybrid

VIRTUAL HYBRID INSTRUCTION (VH) classes are distance education classes that combine scheduled live streaming Zoom meetings and online instruction. Students will attend class virtually on Zoom during the published course times and will logon to Canvas at **sac.edu/Canvas** and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.



Online & On-Campus Meetings (H) **ON-CAMPUS HYBRID INSTRUCTION (H)** classes are distance education classes that combine scheduled on-campus meetings and online instruction. Students will attend class on-campus during the published course times and will logon to Canvas at **sac.edu/Canvas** and complete work regularly throughout the week. Canvas and other technologies will be required to complete coursework.



On Campus (C)

ON-CAMPUS (C) classes are on-campus and in-person with scheduled meeting days and times. Students will complete their course on campus.

TEXTBOOK AFFORDABILITY

OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES (OER)



Open Educational Resources (OER) refers to textbooks or online materials that are in the public domain or have a Creative Commons license. Classes listed with an OER symbol use free course materials unless noted in the course schedule comments. A course using Lumen Learning OER will charge a material fee for the online resource.

ZERO TEXTBOOK COST (ZTC)



Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) refers to courses that eliminate conventional textbook costs by using alternative instructional materials and methodologies, including freely usable Open Educational Resources. Classes listed with a (ZTC) symbol use free course materials.

The college strives to ensure that the OER and ZTC designations are accurate; however, under some circumstances, faculty may have to adjust selection of instructional materials and this can affect course material costs. It may also be necessary to change instructors. Replacement faculty have academic freedom to choose instructional materials regardless of costs and are not obligated to use free course materials selected by an instructor previously assigned to the class.



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
