Student Satisfaction Survey 2021 Report

Details:

354 participants: All credit students, excluding criminal justice and fire academy, were invited to

participate in the survey

Survey Launched: April 18, 2021 Survey Closed: October 4, 2021

Background: The Santa Ana College (SAC) Student Satisfaction Survey is administered by the Rancho Santiago Community College District Research, Planning, and Institutional Effectiveness Department for Santa Ana College. It was completed in the early fall term by students who were enrolled in the spring 2021 term. This cohort of students experienced the continual remote instruction in response to the COVID-19 crisis as well as a gradual return to face-to-face instruction.

Highlights:

- Since survey incentives were not offered this year, the response rate was considerably lower compared to the prior year when survey incentives were offered 2021(N=354) vs. 2020 (N=2321)
- Survey participation decreased significantly (-85%) compared to 2020 survey participation
- One new question was added this year (Question 6)
- Majority of the participants were Female (68%)
- Students within the twenty to twenty-five age group (32%) were represented at a higher percentage than all the other age groups
- Students reported that they had a good experience with remote instruction (60%) compared to (40%) in 2020
- Students indicated that for them to be successful at SAC they desired counseling/other such as (better communication, don't know, mental health, socially involved, personal accountability, daycare, etc.) support (40%) compared to (8%) in 2020
- Students indicated that they preferred face to face instruction at a (8%) increased from 2020
- Students planned to attend in the fall semester (82%) compared to (20%) in 2020
- Students preferred online instruction at a 42% increase compared to 2020
- Students indicated that the most impactful challenge due to COVID-19 that they are facing and might negatively impact them from completing their education is stress, worry about getting sick, and mental health (12%) compared to (3%) in 2020
- Majority of respondents are excited, can't wait, and/or are ready to return to in-person instruction
- Students scheduled an appointment with a counselor within the past year to discuss classes, requirements, and plans (-10%) than in 2020
- Students feel less of a sense of belonging (70%) compared to (80%) in 2020
- In addition to attending SAC, students who stated they are also attending another college or university during spring 2021 term increased by 4% compared to 2020
- On average, for a typical 3-unit class, students spent more than 10 hours studying equaling (12%) compared to (10%) in 2020
- Students were not aware of SAC's noncredit programs (60%) compared to (63%) in 2020
- When choosing a degree pathway, students found that the SAC website was not as helpful, a (-8%) decrease compared to 2020
- Students who live with six or more household members decreased (-4%) compared to 2020




- Students who support themselves and between two or more other people in their household increased slightly (1%) overall from 2020
- Students who are facing unemployment, but would like to be working during this time decreased
 - (-7%) compared to 2020
- Students indicated they are undocumented (13%) compared to (10%) in 2020


Demographics of Survey Participants:

Racial Groups






Gender


- "I had a good online experience during the spring 2021 semester overall. Professors made clear that they would make sure to answer any questions via email or through pronto or canvas, and there were plenty of resources available for students online."
- "It was horrible with the professor that never responded to their email messages! Unfortunately, that..."
- "To be honest I love remote instruction because I have panic attacks, ADHD, and I am bipolar, so for me taking a class online is 10x easier than having to go into class and feel judged."
- "My experience has been challenging, but I know that my education is important and will help me in the future, so I keep pushing and keep sticking for success."
- "Overall, my experience was great, and professors were easily accessible."
- "It was fine. By this semester I was already used to it and it felt normal somewhat. There was a human element that was missing and I'm definitely glad to go back in person."
- "I really struggled. not enough on campus time for anatomy lab. it's not the same looking at pictures than seeing the models in person."
- "Poor communication and philosophy professor taught 90% Marxist / feminist content, almost no philosophy."
- "I was not ok with remote learning but after taking my last course that was only offered online, I feel that my opinion has changed. My professor was aware of my feeling, and she did a great lob assisting and guiding me through the course."
- "Great! I prefer live remote to just straight online classes."
- "It was hard and sometimes disappointing."



- "In-person workspaces"




Q.3. Do you plan to attend SAC in the fall semester?






Q. 4. What instructional method do you prefer for the fall semester?




- "I'm Scared of getting COVID at school."











Percent of "Good" and "Excellent" ratings





Percent of "Good" and "Excellent" ratings





Percent of "Good" and "Excellent" ratings





Percent of "Good" and "Excellent" ratings





Percent of "Very Often" and "Often" ratings





Percent of "Very Often" and "Often" ratings





Percent of "Very Often" and "Often" ratings




Q. 9B.(2) IN THE PAST 12 MONTHS, how often have you done the following?



Percent of "Very Often" and "Often" ratings





Percent of "Strongly Agree" and "Agree" ratings ■ 2021 ■ 2020 ■ 2019












Q. 13. On average, how many hours a week do you spend studying or preparing outside of class for a typical 3-unit class?






Q. 14. On average, how many hours a week do you spend on campus other than attending classes?






Q15. Are you aware of the noncredit program on campus that offers free short-term, entry-level employment preparation programs,...?






Q. 16. Are you aware of SAC's Community Services program that provides additional options for educational opportunities to the community?







SAC Student Satisfaction Survey - Rating of Services & Programs 2017 - 2021 (sorted by average rating)










