Abstract:

The article discusses the relation of the potential outcomes paradigm of causal inference and regression to civil rights litigation. It notes that the paradigm provides a way to reduce expert witness bias through the assessment of questions in litigation and identification of unrealistic questions. Moreover, the framework of potential outcomes aids in the clarification of data that must be collected to implement studies with believable conclusions. It states that the processes involved in implementing a regression in modern civil rights litigation does not require as much effort compared to potential outcomes framework. The application of potential outcomes paradigm in the death penalty, discrimination in employment, and redistricting settings are also discussed.
