## **Independent Student Admission Procedures**

*CJA 099A* is identified as the Orange County Sheriff's Basic Police Academy program. Academy entrance requirements for independent (non-sponsored) students <u>must</u> be met prior to gaining academy admission. The following prerequisites and requirements are applicable to the Basic course:

- Santa Ana College reserves 15% of each class for self-sponsored students, provided they meet all application deadlines and prerequisite requirements. Unfilled positions are released to sponsoring agencies at application filing deadline.
- Students <u>must</u> successfully complete CJA 010, *Pre-Employment Preparation for Law Enforcement* course prior to application deadline.
- Students <u>must</u> satisfactorily complete the California *POST Entry-Level Law Enforcement Test Battery* (PELLETB) reading and writing skills examination prior to submitting CJA file and application.
- Students <u>must</u> schedule a counseling session with the Criminal Justice Academies Coordinator to begin admission process. Students should be prepared to discuss their goals, education, preparation, employment history, and personal background history including arrests, prior drug use and financial history.
- Students <u>must</u> complete and return the CJA File application at least <u>60</u> days before start of academy. The file includes acknowledgements, disclaimers, a Personal History Questionnaire, and copy of student's valid California Driver's License. This file is obtained during the CJA Coordinator counseling session.
- Students <u>must</u> certify their physical health for the course by obtaining and providing the college with results of a medical examination verified by a licensed physician. Must be completed at least <u>45</u> days prior to the start of academy.
- Students <u>must</u> obtain from the California Department of Justice written certification that there is nothing in their criminal history background which would disqualify them from owning, possessing, or having under their control any firearm. Must be completed at least <u>45</u> days prior to start of academy.
- Students <u>must</u> provide a certified copy of their driver's license status and driving record from the California Department of Motor Vehicles. Must be completed at least <u>45</u> days prior to start of academy.
- Students <u>must</u> participate in a formal preparation assessment with CJA staff to determine overall preparation for the academy. If students have not completed CJA 009B *Physical Fitness for Law Enforcement Applicants* course, they must successfully complete a fitness agility test as determined by CJA staff.
- Students are advised to complete CJA 041 Training Academy Preparation course, and CJA 009B Physical Fitness for Law Enforcement Applicants course prior to admission into academy.
- Admission into the Basic Academy will be granted upon completion of all prerequisites and requirements and with the approval of the Criminal Justice Academies Coordinator.
