Students will also have the opportunity to participate in supervised fieldwork in K-12 settings.

The minimum educational requirements to be an elementary teacher include BA/BS and a passing score on the California Basic Skills Education Test (CBEST) and the California Subjects Examinations for Teachers (CSET). For elementary teachers, they must also pass the Reading Instruction Competence Assessment (RICA).

Community college education industry certificates can ensure employers that students are well prepared to work with children in their expanded learning programs or classroom settings.
