

Distance Education Instructor Certification Policy

Santa Ana College requires instructors to complete all training components before teaching an online or hybrid course as outlined below.

Phase 1: Before an instructor is assigned to teach a distance education class for the first time they must complete training I and II:

Phase 2: After an instructor has started teaching a distance education course, it is strongly recommended that they complete the following:

- Mentoring from an experienced distance education instructor for at least the first semester and longer if deemed appropriate.
- Continue professional development in online teaching and new technology

Phase 2 can be accomplished through a variety of means including but not limited to:

- Presenting or participating in online learning multimedia courses and workshops offered during Santa Ana College Professional Development Week.
- Participation in conferences, webinars, listservs, forums or workshops related to online teaching.
- Mentoring new online instructors.

Ongoing Evaluation

A critical component of maintaining the quality of online education is continued evaluation. Online classes are evaluated as part of the ongoing instructor evaluation process. Online and traditional instruction are dissimilar, they require different skill sets for class preparation and delivery. If an instructor teaches both online and in the classroom, it is strongly recommended that both venues be evaluated in a comprehensive instructional evaluation.
