1. MINUTES OF MEETING OF DECEMBER 1, 2008. The minutes of the meeting of DECEMBER 1, 2008 were approved.
2. TECHNICAL COMMITTEE REPORT. APPROVED
3. CURRICULUM ITEMS. See attachment.
4. “TO BE ARRANGED HOURS” UPDATES. Norm discussed concerns raised with the Chancellor’s Office over “To Be Arranged” hours and informed the committee that there would probably be some consideration given to several specific issues. In particular, Foreign Language Labs may be allowed to use an instructor who meets minimum qualifications in only one language to supervise the lab. In addition there may be further clarification in the definition of “regularly scheduled” TBA hours. This will refer to the fact that students must participate in the same number of stated hours per week for each week the class is scheduled. Rigorous requirements for monitoring student hour’s remains in effect. Norm will keep us updated on these issues.
5. CURRICUNET. Norm had a discussion with Sylvia LeTourneau at the District office about adopting CurricuNet since SCC is currently using this platform. It would be a fixed cost which District IT would cover the cost. Almost 50% of the community colleges in the state are using CurricuNet. There will be more discussion at the next Curriculum & Instruction Council meeting after the divisions have had a chance to review the item.
6. COURSE EQUIVALENCY. Deferred until next meeting.
7. COMPUTER PROFICIENCY. Bonnie & Shelly informed the committee about a discussion they had with SCC concerning the Computer Skills and Applications Requirement; section VI of the plan A Associate Degree Requirements. Bonnie mentioned that SCC is considering either adding to the list of majors in part A of this section or eliminating the Computer Skills

Requirement entirely. The committee discussed this issue and further discussion will take place at the next Curriculum and Instruction meeting.

8. PORTFOLIO ASSESSMENT/PROGRAM REVIEW
