Business Administration, Elementary Education, Geography, Kinesiology, and Political Science. Four out of the five were submitted to the State Chancellors Office and currently awaiting approval. Monica informed the council members of the California Community Colleges Board of Governors goal that each college that offers a degree that has an approved TMC will have an approved AA-T/AS-T degree in 80 percent of the majors by the fall of 2013 and 100 percent by the fall of 2014. SAC will require 16 approved AA-T/AS-T by the fall of 2013 to meet the 80% goal. We currently have 9 and are in need of 7 by spring 2013.

2. Paula mentioned to the council that C-I.D descriptors need to be submitted for articulation before the AA-T/AS-T proposals are submitted to the Chancellor's Office. Effective January 1, 2013, all AA-T and AS-T proposals submitted to the Chancellor's Office for review and approval must demonstrate that courses included in the degree have been submitted for C-ID numbers, where descriptors exist. The course's C-ID number may be in pending or final status. Also, the course outline of record cannot be more than 5 years old.

7. CURRICUNET UPDATE

Dr. Rose announced to the council about the upgrade to CurricUNET META. The new upgrade system should be launched by August 2013. A workgroup has been established. Council members were encouraged to provide feedback to Monica regarding current CurricUNET issues and she will bring them forward to the workgroup. Training sessions will be provided to Faculty and Staff after the system in the future.

8. <u>OTHER</u>

1. Monica reminded council members that the section on the Course Outline of record pertaining to Textbooks and Instructional Materials should not be left blank. Even if there is no official textbook for the course, instructional/reading materials should be identified. Monica also provided the council members with information regarding textbooks and instructional materials from "The Course Outline of Record: Curriculum Reference Guide."

2. Monica reminded council members that when courses that offer an Honors section are brought forward for approval to the C&I Council, the Honor Addendum needs to be provided at the same time. Also, when programs are brought forward for approval, please be sure that all courses that are listed in the program have first been approved through the C&I council. The Kinesiology – Coaching Certificate was approved last semester but is still on HOLD since two elective courses have not yet been approved by the C&I Council.

4. History 122 will be removed from the Political Science AS-T degree. The chair of the history department informed the originators of the degree that the department has made the decision to delete this course from their departmental offerings and will be submitting this change to the C&I council in the near future.

5. Monica reminded faculty about the prerequisite language of "Minimum grade of C" which can be done in a systematic fashion through CurricUNET.

7. Monica welcomed Jinhee Trone, Business Division, and Brian Sos, Kinesiology Division as new C&I Council representatives replacing Craig Takahashi and Jodi Coffman. The council would like to thank both Craig and Jodi for their contributions to the Curriculum and Instruction Council.
