

The Student Success Grant Program

Supporting student persistence and success Initiatives throughout the Academic Year

In an effort to continue to support student success and in support of the President's goals focused on student persistence and success, the Santa Ana College Foundation has merged our Innovation and Sustaining Excellence Grant program which will expand our support in these areas. This support comes from the Foundation's annual fund dollars which include our President's Circle program funds. We are excited to provide college leaders with the opportunity to seek grants that may be renewed over a two year period for grant ranges between \$500- \$2,500 in total funding.

Who is eligible to apply?

Any member of the SAC community (faculty, staff, and students) is eligible to submit an application, but the area dean or immediate manager's signature is required because they will partner with grantees to help manage funds that are awarded through this program. All aspects of the application will be considered, so please be as detailed as possible in explaining the previous success achieved and the benefits of continuing and/or expanding the effort and the impact filling this gap has on Santa Ana College students.

What are the program requirements?

- *Student-Centeredness:* The purpose of the program is to expand and sustain student success and persistence where possible. Therefore, students should be the direct beneficiaries of the projects proposed.
- *Evidence of Effectiveness:* Applicants must submit a proposal with evidence that it works. The project may be an innovation grant and or another student centered initiative that previously proven effective outcomes that and is ready for expansion or another effort that has proven its value and should be continued.
- *Timeframe:* Projects may be up to two years in duration. .*Renews can be submitted to range over a twoyear period.**Subject to Approval*
- *Funding Amount:* A maximum of \$2,500 total may be requested.*Renews can be submitted to range over a two-year period.**Subject to Approval*

When and exactly how can I apply?

- Student Success grant applications will be accepted two period throughout the Academic year- <u>October</u> <u>25th through November 30th, 2011 and then again in the Spring</u> **Dates for Spring will be announced at the beginning of 2012.*
- Individual consultation is also available through the SAC Foundation to support your proposal development.
