YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO FEEL SAFE AND ACCEPTED HERE!

Title IX is a federal law that prohibits the following:

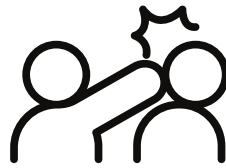
SEXUAL HARASSMENT

is unwelcome sexual behavior, like comments, jokes, or touching, that makes it hard for a student to learn, feel safe, or take part in school activities.



DATING VIOLENCE

is abuse or harm from someone you're in (or were in) a romantic or intimate relationship with. It can be physical, emotional, verbal, or controlling behavior.



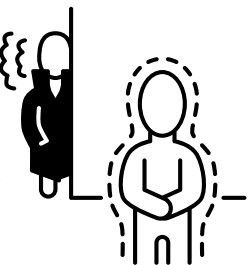
SEXUAL ASSAULT

is any sexual activity that happens without clear, voluntary consent. This includes situations where someone is forced, threatened, unconscious, or under the influence of drugs or alcohol.



STALKING

is when someone keep doing unwanted things over and over that make you feel scared or stressed. This can include following you, watching you, leaving unwanted gifts, sending constant messages, or taking your photo or videos without your permission.



DISCRIMINATION

is unfair or mean treatment based on someone's gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. It can look like bullying or harassment and can make school feel unsafe or hard to be part of.



PREGNANCY & RELATED CONDITIONS

If you're pregnant, recently gave birth, or have a related condition, you have the right to stay in school & keep up with your classes. You're also entitled to reasonable accommodations, like more restroom breaks, adjusted deadlines, or a private lactation space.
