#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

Upon completion of the course students will be able to:

- 1. apply courthouse operating rules set up for peace officers
- 2. practice basic officer safety tactics within courthouse security protocols
- 3. develop a familiarization with the courthouse layout and the personnel who work there
- 4. recognize the importance of a law enforcement officer's actions and demeanor in shaping the public's opinion of law enforcement

- 6. recognize the importance of proper preparation for a court appearance
