Participants will study investigative techniques and solve a crime scene using a forensics team approach. Essential employability skills include personal, interpersonal and communication skills plus units on career development and employment literacy. Criminal Procedures/CSI: This course focuses on the criminal justice system and law in America. Instruction includes police, law enforcement processes and procedures as well as the court system, trials and corrections.
