Audio Book Program for ESL/EMLS Students	Starting in 2008, students in our ESL Listening Lab began using audio books to enhance reading, listening and vocabulary skills. With a small Innovation Grant of \$500 in 2008 and another \$1000 Innovation Grant in 2010, the lab has procured a library of 48 titles and 96 books at beginning through advanced levels of ESL. Seventeen ESL instructors assign the audio books and accompanying assessment exercises as part of the department's 16-hour lab requirement.
