# SANTA ANA COLLEGE

# **Bachelor of Science Degree in Occupational Studies**

#### **Description:**

In March of 2016, the California Community College Board of Governors voted unanimously to approve Santa Ana College's Occupational Studies (OS) Bachelor of Science degree. This program is one of 15 community college bachelor degree programs that have been approved in the state. Accreditation for this program is through the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior College (ACCJC), Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Santa Ana College plans to start offering upper division courses in the fall of 2017. The first 4 semesters of the OS degree is the completion of an Associate's degree in Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) from a school with regional accreditation. Please refer to the Santa Ana College catalog for a description of the current OTA program. There will be four (4) semesters of upper division coursework to complete the OS degree.

The Bachelor of Science degree in Occupational Studies will provide in-depth instruction in the principles of practice used by the OTA that are designed to build on the foundational education provided at the Associate's level of education. The instruction will enable the student to broaden their current practice in specialty areas of practice and with a variety of populations. It will also prepare the student to understand and utilize research-based evidence in patient treatment. Further, it will prepare the OTA for leadership positions.

### **Program Outcomes – Occupational Studies:**

- 1. Demonstrate advanced mastery of OTA clinical skills, including clinical reasoning, that follow the guidelines established in the Frameworks for Occupational Therapy Practice.
- 2. Relate theory and research to clinical practice areas.
- 3. Ability to provide OTA services that meets the community needs of diverse populations demonstrating sensitivity and empathy.
- 4. Prepared for participation in advocacy for clients in clinical and community settings.

#### **Career Options:**

Occupational Therapy Assistants provide service to individuals with physical, mental, or developmental disabilities across the lifespan to perform self-care, work and/or leisure activities that provide a greater quality of life. The in-depth instruction in the Bachelor of Science degree in Occupational Studies will prepare students to provide more effective treatment, work in settings that require a bachelor's degree, to take OTA leadership positions and to continue on to graduate level Occupational Therapy education. It will also prepare students to have careers in other areas such as home modification, durable medical equipment development and sales, and innovative programs for older adults.
