OCEMS may periodically request information or documents or make site visits, scheduled as well as unannounced, to ensure compliance with these criteria. Programs that are not in compliance may be placed on probation, suspension, or approval may be revoked. See Title 22 and OCEMS policy 510.00 for additional information. Programs are also responsible to notify OCEMS within 30 days of any change in key program staff or other program elements.
