

# ~DAY BY DAY ITINERARY~

From the lighthouses and famous rock formations to historic cities like Astoria and Eugene to quaint beach communities like Newport and Bandon... from wine tasting in the Willamette Valley to taste testing at the Tillamook cheese factory....from a mail jet boat ride on the Rogue River to a sealife cruise and a ride on a 4-wheel vehicle over the Oregon dunes... this comprehensive journey features incredible sights, unique experiences, the captivating sights and sounds of the Oregon Coast and the nostalgic and romantic covered bridges.



# **DAY 1 ~ ARRIVE OREGON, ASTORIA**

Start with optional transfers from home or our departure points this morning to LAX for a nonstop flight to Portland, Oregon. Upon our arrival a deluxe motorcoach will be waiting to transport us for the next eight days. We will venture westward from Portland, following the Columbia River to the historic city of Astoria, the oldest American settlement west of the Rockies. A visit to Fort Clatsop National Memorial, the winter headquarters of the Lewis and Clark expedition and the first U.S. military post west of St. Louis. Enjoy lunch and browsing at leisure in historic downtown Astoria before we continue our journey south along the coast route. Our overnight accommodations are located just steps from the pristine beach and ocean front promenade. An included welcome dinner this evening at a local favorite. (Dinner)

## ◆DAY 2 ~ BEACHES, TILLAMOOK◆

Following an included breakfast we continue south following US-101 and the spectacular Oregon Coast. As we leisurely make our way on this scenic route we'll find magnificent panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean along with lighthouses, sheer cliffs, pristine beaches, pounding surf and the warm hospitality of the merchants and residents. Enjoy time at leisure



in the artsy village of Cannon Beach where you may want to watch the kite flyers or photograph Haystack Rock, the famous landmark towering 235 feet above sea level. This is the third largest coastal monolith in the world and its closeness to the beach will astound you. A brief stop in Rockaway Beach to see Twin Rocks. We then arrive in Tillamook, a city synonymous with the dairy industry. We'll tour the factory and you'll have a bird's-eye view of the cheese making and packaging teams in action, churning out 167,000 pounds of Tillamook Cheese each and every day and they have samples too! We continue on following the breathtaking Three Capes Scenic Drive and visiting the unique Lookout Gift **Shop**, perched high above the Pacific at **Otter** Rock. A visit to Yaquina Head Lighthouse, Oregon's tallest lighthouse. We arrive in Newport for a two-night stay at one of the finest hotels on the Oregon coast. Located high on a bluff overlooking the pristine beach and Pacific Ocean below, every room is oceanfront with a private balcony and fireplace. (Breakfast)



# ◆DAY 3 ~ NEWPORT◆

This morning, following an included breakfast we visit the **Oregon Coast Aquarium** where we can immerse ourselves in the mysteries of the ocean. This Aquarium is a world-class marine educational attraction nestled on 4½-acres on

beautiful Yaquina Bay. Come face to face with the creatures living in offshore and near-shore Pacific marine habitats: frolicking sea otters, colorful puffins, pulsating jellyfish, and even a 60-pound octopus. Walk through a 200-foot underwater tunnel with 360-degree views of sharks, wolf eels, halibut, and a truly captivating array of sea life. Later we embark on a narrated sealife cruise with an onboard naturalist guide to look for marine mammals and birds in their natural environment. Aboard the deluxe 65-foot Discovery we'll enjoy the incredible scenery of Yaquina Bay featuring the largest fishing fleet on the Oregon coast. Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure relaxing at the hotel or walking on the beach. An included dinner this evening. (Breakfast, Dinner)

## **DAY 4 ~ LIGHTHOUSE, DUNES •**

After an included breakfast this morning we continue south to the 19th-century Haceta Head Lighthouse, on the National Register of Historic Places. Built in 1894, the light emitted is the most powerful on the Oregon Coast, signaling ships up to 21 miles out to sea. Then, we'll gear up as we approach the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area, a natural wonder of endless shifting sand, unique tree islands and lots of interesting creatures. You'll board a four-wheel drive vehicle driven by an experienced guide for an exhilarating ride up and down these expansive tracts of sand that are almost 300 feet high. We continue south to Coos Bay and tour a myrtle wood factory, where you can see master craftsmen at work carving wooden items made from this native hardwood only found in Oregon and Israel. Later today we arrive in Bandon-bythe-Sea with its unique offshore rock formations for a two-night stay at a property within steps of the beach. (Breakfast)

## **DAY 5 ~ BANDON, ROGUE RIVER**

An included breakfast this morning before we explore Bandon State Natural Area. You will be amazed by the scenery along the scenic Beach Loop with sights such as Bandon Rocks and Face Rock, known to many from the American Indian legend. Anticipation mounts as we travel south to Gold Beach for a thrilling ride aboard a high-speed jet boat through one of Oregon's great natural treasures, the scenic Rogue River. This Congress-designated National Wild and Scenic River tumbles and roars from high in the Cascade Range to the shores of the Pacific and is home to tons of native wildlife. Your river boat guide will point out any black bear, river otter, black-tail deer, bald eagles, great blue heron and Canada geese, all commonly seen along the river! You will be following in the foot steps of history along the 'Historic Mail Boat Route' just as Rogue River pioneers have done since 1895 when mail and freight were prized commodities and road access did not exist. We return to Bandon

this evening with time to browse Bandon's Old Town featuring a number of unique galleries and shops. (Breakfast, Lunch)

# **•DAY 6 ~ WINE TASTING, EUGENE•**

Oregon is known for its wildlife, and elk are some of the most majestic and interesting animals in the state. Following an included breakfast we travel to an elk viewing area to view this majestic creatures. Besides elk and lighthouses and spectacular beaches, Oregon is known for their wines. We continue over the Coastal Range to the Willamette Valley often compared with the wine-producing region of Burgundy, France because of similar latitudinal, soil and climatic conditions. We'll enjoy a tasting, tour and an included lunch at the King Estate Winery which uses organic farming and winemaking methods to produce award-winning wines. The beautiful estate of 1,033 acres is crowned by the charming, European-style winery. Later today we arrive in Eugene and begin a two-night stay at a unique resort-style hotel located along the quiet banks of the Willamette River and your room will include a river view. (Breakfast, Lunch)

## **DAY 7 ~ COVERED BRIDGES**

Following an included breakfast we set out with a **local guide** to explore the nostalgic and romantic covered bridges in **Cottage Grove**, the "Covered Bridge Capital of Oregon". Oregon has the largest collection of covered bridges in the West and one of the largest in the nation. The covered-bridge-building tradition in Oregon dates from the 1850s when rugged pioneers armed with only hand tools, sweat and ambition began building covered bridges. With our guide we will visit some of the most picturesque and unique bridges in the area and get a look at a well-preserved past in the beautiful setting of the Pacific Northwest. An included **farewell dinner** this evening. (Breakfast, Dinner)



# **DAY 8 ~ JOURNEY HOME**

Following an included breakfast this morning we travel north through **Salem** and arrive at the Portland Airport for our nonstop return flight to Los Angeles. We return home with images of Oregon's coast, lighthouses, covered bridges, and so much more forever ingrained in our memories. (Breakfast)
