REFUND & TRANSFER POLICY FOR ALL EVENTS:

Refund and transfer requests must be made (5) business days prior to the event less a \$15 processing fee per person. Day Tours: may be canceled up to 10 days prior to departure date less a \$15 processing fee. A refund will only be issued if your space can be re-sold. You may send a substitute in place. Multi Day Tours: Travel Protection insurance is highly recommended. A refund will be issued less a \$50 cancellation fee. Non receipt of confirmation does not warrant a refund for any event.

RETURNED CHECKS & REFUNDS BY CHECK, CASH OR MONEY ORDER:

A \$25 fee will be charged for any returned check. In addition, an administration hold placed against your student records and a class stop will be issued. Refunds issued for cash, check or money order transactions may take 4-5 weeks to process with a completed W-9 form.

GROUP SWIM LESSONS



SWIM LEVELS

LITTLE FISH SWIMMERS (AGES 3-5)

Level 1 (Beginning): Children with little or no swimming experience. Skills taught: water entry, floats, kicking, glides, arm action on front & back, intro to side breathing and water safety.

Level 2 (Intermediate): Children must have basic skill; floating, kicking, comfortable swimming unassisted for 5-10 yards with arm action. Skills taught: freestyle with side breathing, backstroke, and intro to breaststroke & butterfly.

JUNIOR SWIMMERS (AGES 6-12)

Level 1 (Beginning): Children with minimal swimming experience. Skills taught: water entry, floats, kicking, glides, arm action on front & back, intro to side breathing and water safety.

Level 2 (Intermediate): Children must have basic skill; floating, kicking, comfortable swimming unassisted for 5-10 yards with arm action. Skills taught: freestyle with side breathing, backstroke, and intro to breaststroke & butterfly.

*Children at a more advanced level looking to develop stroke technique and endurance we recommend our Swim Camp.

On the first day please arrive 15 minutes early to check in. Please bring a towel and slip-on shoes/sandals. Your child must come dressed to swim and have sunscreen applied.

No make-up lessons or refunds for missed days due to unavoidable biological accidents or acts of nature.

Our lessons are split into two age groups:

Little Fish Swimmers (ages 3-5) and Jr. Swimmers (ages 6-12).

Each group has two levels beginning & intermediate. See more details below.

Please register your child for the level below that best fits your ability.

We will evaluate the swimmers on the first day of class and may regroup them according to skill level.
