### LEVEL - DAY BY DAY ITINERARY-

## Embark on a spectacular journey following the colorful trails of the Southwest. Inside New Mexico's borders you'll find ancient cultures, world-famous Southwestern cuisine, diverse landscapes, renowned museums, and a hot air balloon festival like no other on Earth. From Albuquerque to Santa Fe and Taos, this journey will leave you knowing why its called the "Land of Enchantment."



### •DAY 1 ~ ARRIVE ALBUQUERQUE•

Optional transfers from home or our departure points this morning will have us at Los Angeles International Airport for our flight arriving in Albuquerque, New Mexico this afternoon. Upon our arrival, a deluxe motorcoach will be waiting to transport us to historic Old Town Albuquerque with time for lunch and browsing at leisure. Since it was founded in 1706 by Spanish Settlers, the Old Town area has remained the center for Southwest culture, architecture, shopping, art and cuisine. Later we check-in to our Albuquerque hotel for a leisurely threenight stay with a complimentary food and drink reception nightly. This evening, get ready for a real treat at the Balloon Glow at Albuquerque Fiesta Park (weather permitting). Just before dusk, the burners of nearly 500 balloons are ignited and the evening sky fills with a kaleidoscope of brilliant, luminous color. Delicious foods are available as are a wide range of vendors selling souvenirs. We top off the evening with a vivid **fireworks show**.

### ◆DAY 2 ~ ALBUQUERQUE◆

Following an included breakfast this morning we set out to discover the gems around Albuquerque with a local guide aboard. On a guided tour of Albuquerque we'll see the **San Felipe de Neri Church**, **Rio Grande Park**, the **Ernie Pyle Home** and the **University of New Mexico** before touring and time at leisure in Old Town Albuquerque. This afternoon, we travel to the **Acoma Pueblo**,



# often called "Sky City", it is situated 350 feet above an outstretched valley atop a massive sandstone mesa at 7,000 feet above sea level. It is the oldest continuously inhabited settlement in the United States and a Pueblo member will take you on a guided tour of the Pueblo village, explaining the culture and history here. An included lunch in Acoma. This evening, after time to freshen up, an included dinner at a local favorite. (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)



### **DAY 3 ~ ALBUQUERQUE**

This morning following an included breakfast we visit the Turquoise Museum to see the largest collection of turquoise in the world. Uncover the mystery of turquoise, delve into its' rich history, learn about the different mines, specimens, and stories of colorful characters. Later we visit the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center which tells the story of New Mexico's Pueblo Indian culture through authentic native arts, craft, and dance demonstrations. Then, we board the Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway (the world's longest free-span cable tramway) and ride to the top of Sandia Peak for a thrilling panoramic view of Albuquerque and the Rio Grande Valley from this mountain perch at 10,375 feet above sea level. Enjoy an included lunch at the top. This afternoon we tour the International Balloon Museum which showcases the development of ballooning through historic,

scientific and artistic objects including postage stamps, post cards, coins, jewelry, photographs, early pins, World War I era collectible porcelains and much more. Dinner at leisure this evening with a variety of restaurants available. (Breakfast, Lunch)

### **DAY 4 ~ FIESTA, TURQUOISE TRAIL**◆

It's an early rise this morning as we depart for Albuquerque Fiesta Park and the worldrenowned International Balloon Fiesta. The Fiesta began in 1972 with 13 balloons and has grown to over 900 participants to become the world's largest hot air ballooning event. Walk right up to the balloons and watch as hundreds of crews prepare for the "Mass Ascension" of hundreds of uniquely shaped balloons at sunrise (weather permitting). Spend the morning at your leisure enjoying this arts and crafts along the Midway and watch as the sky becomes painted with hundreds of bright and beautiful balloons of all different shapes. An optional excursion to ride in a hot air balloon along with hundreds of other balloons also in flight will be available for an additional charge. Later in the day we set our sights on Santa Fe as we travel along the famed Turquoise Trail National Scenic Byway and pass old ghost towns and beautiful scenery to Santa Fe, nestled at the foot of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains. Founded in 1610, Santa Fe is the oldest seat of government in the United States and this capital city reflects its Spanish, Pueblo, and Mexican history. We check-in to our Santa Fe hotel for a relaxing three-night stay. An included dinner this evening in Santa Fe at a local favorite. (Breakfast, Dinner)

### \*DAY 5 ~ SANTA FE\*

Following an included breakfast this morning we are joined by a local guide for a panoramic tour of Santa Fe showcasing the **Palace of the** 



Governors and the Mission of San Miguel, both dating from around 1610. A walking tour and included lunch in Santa Fe's renowned Town Plaza, which marks the end of the Santa Fe Trail. Then visits to both St. Francis Cathedral and New Mexico's circular State Capitol building. A docent-guided tour of the famed Loretto Chapel, a marvel of architectural ingenuity to see its miraculous spiral staircase. The narrow streets of Santa Fe are lined with buildings of distinctive design, adobe houses and eclectic shops. Enjoy the remainder of your day at your leisure to take in this spectacular city and it's vibrant Town Plaza featuring a variety of shops and museums including the Georgia O'Keefe Museum, the Museum of International Folk Art and others. Dinner at leisure this evening in Santa Fe, a food lover's paradise. (Breakfast, Lunch)

### **DAY 6 ~ TAOS**

Today we have an early morning departure for Taos on the Camino Alto, or "High Road", the same route taken by the Spanish colonists through the scenic grandeur of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains past villages that date from the Spanish Colonial era. We arrive in the adobe town of Taos seated on a the high desert mesa within the foothills of the Rocky Mountains. We will stop at the Rio Grande Gorge for a photo opportunity, followed by a visit to the Millicent Rogers Museum featuring outstanding historical collections of Native American art and jewelry, paintings, weavings, and pottery in a superb setting. Time at leisure for lunch and browsing in the charming Taos Plaza. We continue to Taos Pueblo at the northern edge of town, one of the most picturesque of the Southwest adobes. Designated a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, this Pueblo dates from the fourteenth century and is one of the oldest continuously inhabited settlements in North America. Learn about the traditional lifestyle and beliefs of the Pueblo Indians and visit the striking adobe chapel of San Geronimo. On our return to Santa Fe a stop in the village of **Chimayo**, known for its beautiful tapestry weaving and a tour of the Santuario de Chimayo, the famous chapel believed to possess healing powers in its soil. An included farewell dinner at Rancho de Chimayo, a local landmark known for its traditional northern New Mexico cuisine and one of the most visited dining establishments in the world. (Breakfast, Dinner)

### ◆DAY 7 ~ SANTA FE, FINAL FAREWELL◆

After an included breakfast this morning, our afternoon departure from Santa Fe will provide time to fulfill all of your Santa Fe shopping or museum browsing. We return to Albuquerque for our return flight to Los Angeles later in the day. Those with transfers will be returned to their respective destinations. Delightful memories of our time in the "Land of Enchantment" will remain with us forever. (Breakfast)
