- I. EdInsight Case Study Debrief
 - a. One of the main insights is that there appears to be a lot of awareness of Guided Pathways.

 1. Many Classified staff feel like they don't know how they can make a difference, that GP is more Faculty driven.
 2. How to we market it to students in a seamless way?
 3. Many students attend different CC's with different GP Pathways, so it could be confusing for students who aren't exclusive for us. How will students be advised?
 4. How do we permeate campus with the Guided Pathways framework? How do we give space and permission for people to be able to examine how SAC operates in order to improve the student experience?
