APA 6.22-25

(The terminology, *Works Cited*, is not used by APA)

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Citations in the text of the paper are covered on **pages 169-179** of the *Publication Manual*. When using APA format, follow the author-date method of in-text citation.

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The complete bibliographic citation should appear in the *References* list at the end of the paper.
