Library Internship Experiences

Students in the SAC Library Technology Certificate or Associate's Degree Program are trained to work as library assistants or library technicians in public, academic, school (K-12), and special libraries (e.g. museums, archives, etc.) In their last semester, students participate in an internship course to build their resumes and gain experience in practical and real-world settings. Our students have been placed in internships all over Southern California. They receive glowing evaluations on their performances and the internship course has had a 100% student completion rate for many years.

Finding Articles Online Workshop

Over the past year the librarians have been testing a new "Finding Articles" workshop that is available online. After working out some kinks we think we have a final product! Starting in the Spring 2019 semester the librarians will have a stand alone "Finding Articles" Canvas course. This "Finding Articles" course will be a self-enrolled course and upon completion students will be awarded a certificate. This method is less invasive than adding a module to an existing course and requires very little of the faculty's time. More details will be coming soon. In the meantime, the librarians are creating a second online workshop, "Finding Reliable Online Research."
