<u>Claire Coyne</u> – there is another document that explains the difference between academic freedom and freedom of speech and language should be included

Helen Serrano – does this have anything to do with CRT or anything other theories?

Claire Coyne – if it is a scholarly endeavor then it would probably be covered by academic freedom

Jennie Beltran – been going to Union and this is an issue that is being brought up

Claire Coyne – I was wondering if Union or Rep Council will be holding sessions about this?
