Faculty & Local Academic Senate Voice in Participatory Governance

Dr. LaTonya Parker and Christopher Howerton

ASCCC representatives, Dr. LaTonya Parker (Secretary) and Christopher Howerton (At-large Rep.), give a presentation covering many topics: participatory governance, collegial consultation, bargaining, faculty participation, local senate relationship with administration, senate leadership, and the equivalency process.

<u>Claire Coyne</u> – do equivalences need to be updated by a certain time?

<u>LaTonya Parker</u> – that is a local decision

<u>Christopher Howerton</u> – once it's been written, the process to change/update is local

Jeff Lamb – can you address how faculty should review the minimum qualifications for equivalencies?

<u>LaTonya Parker</u> – the minimum qualifications and equivalencies are usually well-vetted locally and would recommend revisiting local process if there are concerns about who is being hired

<u>Roy Shahbazian</u> – can you comment on equivalencies committee structure?

<u>LaTonya Parker</u> – usually areas of expertise would be involved in committee structure

<u>Chris Howerton</u> – local decision should be made on the structure of committee

Merari Weber – if I have a class max of 40, but the room can only fit 20 comfortably?

<u>Chris Howerton</u> – room cap, course cap, section cap can inform the size of the course

Helen Serrano – applauds Merari openness to communication

<u>Kim Smith</u> – leaders that seem to work together successfully are both focused on student success

<u>Merari Weber</u> – does ASCCC offer trainings to new administrators?

<u>LaTonya Parker</u> - ASCCC Do trainings for deans & CTE

<u>Roy Shahbazian</u> – any opportunities for statewide senate?

<u>LaTonya Parker & Chris Howerton</u> – ongoing opportunities, but some specific areas include noncredit, dual enrollment, rising scholars, EEO, PD.
