I. Call to Order

- **A.** Past President John Zarske called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.
- **B.** Introduction
- **II.** <u>Agenda Accepted</u>—A motion to approve the agenda, as amended, made by Charles Jang and seconded by George Moore was unanimously approved.

III. Public Comments

A. A concern was raised that there is a cell phone due out that is going to be in the shape of a gun.

- **B.** A concern was raised that there was a faculty member approached by Santa Ana Police Department (SAPD) on campus last week about a suspicious person on campus, but no text message went out to the campus from Safety and Security. A request was made to look into the process.
- C. The Book Store will be down for one month and will be relocating to The Village on May 19th. Canopies will be set up outside of the Johnson Center and then The Village during April/May. The SAC Café is closed this week, but the Book Store is open until the end of the week to accommodate the students buying books for the second 8 week classes. The Book Store is in negotiations with Pepsi to obtain some kiosks.
- D. The Paralegal program passed the accreditation. The Paralegal program is ABA (American Bar Association) approved and meets the requirements of the California Business and Professionals Code 6450
- **E.** John Steffens, the first Project Manager for Student Services, was introduced to the senate.
- **F.** Veronica Oforlea, new Associate Dean of DSPS, Health and Wellness Center and Psychological Services was introduced to the senate.

IV. Approval of the Minutes—Tabled to the next senate meeting.

V. Topics

- **A.** Trustee Phillip Yarborough was unable to attend due to illness. His visit will be rescheduled.
- **B.** A call for nominations was made for President and Secretary/Treasurer. Nominations will close on Thursday, April 21st. Ballots will be sent out via email on Monday, April 25th and voting will close on April 29th. Place the ballot in a signed envelope with your name printed across the flap and place in the senate mail box.
- C. Past President Zarske presented some of the proposed resolutions related to AB1985 and AB1937 that were discussed at the Area D meeting. A resolution on the "Z Degree" was examined; "Z Degree" stands for zero textbook cost. The list of resolutions will be emailed to the senators this week. President Jones will vote on the resolutions as the SAC delegate on Saturday, April 23rd, so please email him prior to that date with your thoughts regarding any of the resolutions.

VI. Action Item

A. There was a Second Reading of the resolution supporting Assembly Bill 798 (AB798), "College Textbook Affordability Act of 2015." The motion made by Jodi Coffman to approve Resolution S16.1 and seconded by Teresa Simbro was unanimously approved by senate.

VII. Reports

A. President—Elliott Jones

- 1. President Jones reported that a forensic examiner is looking into the cell phones (and AT&T service) that were involved in the incident on campus on March 19th in which a faculty member's call to Safety and Security was not answered despite the office's call forwarding protocol. The incident is still under investigation and a report will be forwarded to President Martinez. Chief Winter reaffirmed that the faculty member handled the situation admirably. In order to assist in tracking any further call forwarding problems, it was suggested that faculty email Lt. Colver if they call campus security and do not get an answer. Suggestions were made by faculty regarding an audio alert system, inside locking mechanisms for doors, and examining other colleges' emergency response systems (e.g. Santa Monica College). President Jones will take suggestions to College Council and Brian Kehlenbach will take suggestions to Facilities.
- 2. At the Board Meeting last night, April 11th, there was supposed to be a Second Reading of Board Policy 3821, but it has gone through many changes and it is going to be similar to the Orange County policy for county employees on gifts. The Board suggested the senate examine the issue of desk copies of textbooks. President Jones suggested the senate consider a resolution on the ethics of textbooks and secondary sales, as there is no past resolution on the topic.

- 3. The Saudi Arabia Agreement has been put on hold.
- **4.** President Martinez will be joining the senate for the second meeting in May, and a celebration honoring the President will take place at that meeting.
- 5. The Presidential Search Committee is meeting for the second time tomorrow, April 13th. Once the committee has interviewed candidates and selected finalists, those finalists will meet with the Chancellor and one Board Member. The goal is to have the new president approved by the Board and ready to assume office upon President Martinez's retirement.
- **6.** Bonnie Jaros was recognized at the Board Meeting for the Women in Higher Education Award.
- 7. Chancellor Rodriguez has been invited to attend the May 10th senate meeting to share updates and answer questions.
