- I. Call to Order and Welcome President Jones called the meeting to order at 9:05 am
- II. Budget Summit Opened with President Jones opening with stating the goal of this budget summit to see how the larger budgeting processes work, how they can work better and how we can do better as an institution -at making sure we understand these processes.

Presented by Michael Collins, Carlos Lopez & Ray Hicks

- Dr. Collins reinforcing that representation on the Budget & Planning is important for the participatory governance we have at SAC and thanks faculty/staff for their involvement.
- Governor's budget proposal is generally positive with slight decreases in some areas. It includes funds encumbered for cloud-based library for California Community students/faculty/staff, available funds for research activities and dedicated funds for statewide Learning Management System. Tied to OEI project & Canvas transition to cover 113 colleges. COLA 1.49% proposed in budget.
- Prop 39 increasing our allocation for energy management
- District's Credit FTES overall decreasing. Spring up 2% (about 100 FTES) for SAC
- Growth of online programs Success and retention rates nearly on par with F2F classes
- Non-credit side down 13% which may be affected to political environment
- Partnership project with SAUSD in works
- Non-credit possibly to go on site lease with SAUSD
- Down 1.8% as a college
- Fiscally stable for the next few years due to a surplus we can dip into if revenues decrease due to decrease enrollment

RAR Process reviewed and clarified. Suggestion in completing RAR's is to use a short narrative for the rationales for funding each investment on the RARs. The clarification is helpful for planning. RARs are an augmentation and have to be tied to the program. Foundation of SAC's budget-based on 4 items

- 1. It is the budget of the college "Our Budget"- our resources together as a college
- 2. Based on good business practices
- 3. Public trust they fund us. Clarity and clear communication to public
- 4. Investment in our students and benefits our students. RAR's based on that.

Importance of marketing our college is necessary to stay competitive and capture more students so we can increase revenue. This is capped at 0.6% growth by state. Accreditation is important feedback to the college for identifying future needs Questions by audience answered by presenters.

III. Presentation - Student Policies - Rosio Becerra Mendoza and Scott Baker

Insightful information regarding the process in addressing student conduct issues and student due process procedures. Discussion of student suspension from campus safety and faculty perspectives and procedures in place to follow. Threat Assessment Team on campus composed of Student Affairs, Safety & Security, DSPS & Psychological Services.

IV. Informational Item: Guided Pathway (GP) Update – Carlos Lopez, Mary Huebsch & George Sweeney presenters

Overarching National Framework SAC is looking at adopting to help students with an educational pathway. Project in Calif (will accept 20 colleges) for funding to assist colleges adopting Guided Pathways to receive support over a 3-year period in the adoption process. Information was shared to faculty concerning GP and an opportunity for faculty to give feedback. George showed a user-friendly website from a technical college with guided pathways that was helpful to students in determining their field of interest & planning an educational path.

- VI. **Approve Minutes from November 22, 2016** Moved: L. Pedroza; Second: E. Fosmire Minutes accepted unanimously. No abstentions.
- VII. **Public Comments** (Three-minute time limit)
 - a. <u>Sara Lundquist</u>- Promise waiting to hear if get 750,000 from state. If we receive the award the entire 2 years at SAC will be funded. It would be secured in perpetuity since it is an endowment with SAC foundation. 328 more students came fulltime and 100 more part-time from SAUSD. Only 7% of those students did not finish their semester in Fall which is half of previous semester.
 - b. <u>Catherine Emley</u>- Scholarship Committee- goal to increase readers for scholarship awards committee. Feb 21st turned-reading begins on the 27th and finish by March 17.
 c. <u>Kristen Guzman</u> FACCD update

FARCCD Advisory committee. Feedback from faculty is goal. Alternate between SA & SCC. Next Feb 24th 9:30-11:00 at SAC. BOARD of Trustees in on Feb 27th at 4:30 at District. 324,000 2015-2016 contract still not settled. In Dec District filed for impasse. Mediator is meeting with FARCCD negotiator and District to try to close 2015-2016 contract. Update after the mediation Friday. Contact info: FARSCCD@gmail.com

VIII. Presentation: DSPS – Louise Janus

- DSPS faculty reduced to 3, so some changes in DSPS occurring. DSPS is in partnership with faculty to assist students. If there is a threat always contact Campus Safety.
- Encourage dialogue with DSPS student to determine specific needs. Student will advocate for self now by presenting their faculty with a letter from DSPS instead of faculty receiving email from DSPS. Faculty voiced disappointment with new procedure- Louise will take back to DSPS the feedback that the faculty liked receiving the emails instead of the student bringing the letter. Students are told that the faculty need advance notice a week -to put accommodations into place.
- Question concerning volunteer note-taking. The volunteer can get priority registration for the following semester.

• The Assessment Center, L-223 is the only location students can now take a test needing accommodations. Exams may be emailed – guidelines for this will be put in faculty mailboxes and emailed.

Vote will be taken on this plan next senate meeting

- Budgeting funds for replacement of computers- needs to be in RAR or no funds for it- that might be why you have an old computer
- Increase in training and guidance for technology. Part-time instructional designer has been hired
- Working on streamlining processes and getting rid of lazy software
- Current staffing needs in ITS on campus. 350 computers:1 tech is our current ratio. Recommendations is 75 computers: 1 tech. SAC goal is 200 computers per tech
- Currently 85% of classrooms are mediated at this time but 100% will be by the end of the year

b. Mission Statement review – Bonnie Jaros

Updating due to accrediting recommendations to pull all plans together and vision themes of accreditation standards R/T mission statement

We have to respond to the 4 Standards

ER = Eligibility Standard

Input from faculty to Bonnie:

- It is too long and redundant
- Maybe go to bullet points
- Pulling up the 2nd sentence- incorporate into first
- Says intellectual twice
- The statement fits 1-3 but missing #4
- Focus on student achievement and learning
