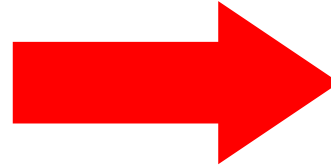

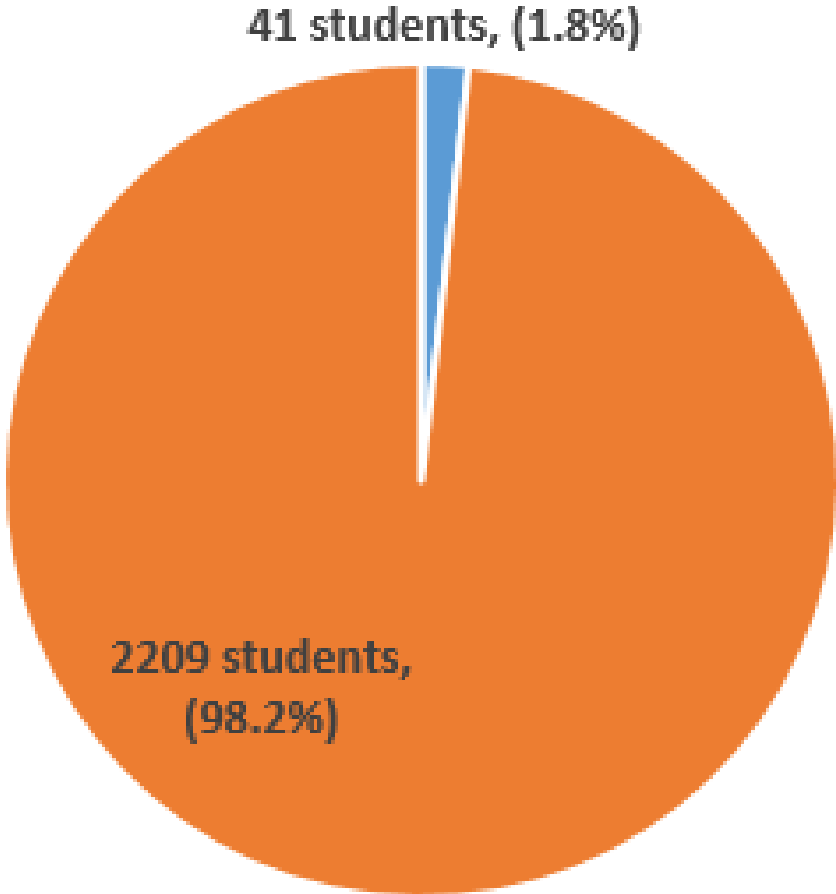

- Serves first-time, full-time students in target populations.
 - Laptops will be loaned like books from the library for the entire academic term.
 - 1,100 laptops will be deployed in Phase One (2016-2017).

Purchase Program Goal: *To make state of the art technology tools available to students at a terrific price point*

- Laptops will be available for purchase through The Don Bookstore just like academic textbooks.
- The Bookstore is servicing the pass through of the price of \$260 with \$-0- overhead associated with their costs.
- Financial aid and scholarship funds can be directly applied through the bookstore to purchase the laptops and pick them up.

NOTE: SAC has established IQ Bars on campus staffed with tech-savvy peer mentors to help students maximize the value & functions of their PC.

Academic Probation: A GPA of below 2.0

Progress Probation: Withdrawing from 50% or more of your total units.

- ⇒ Go to **Student Menu** and click on “**Unofficial Transcript**” link.
- ⇒ Select “**UNOFF Unofficial College Credit**” and **Submit**.
