






Success Rate by Age & Gender






Success Rate by Ethnicity & Gender








Enrollment Trend





FTES Trend by Division






Current Enrollment Academic Year 2023-2024





English as a Second Language (ESL)

Adult Basic Education (ABE)



Prepares students for academic success in high school, career training, and more. Classes include:

Many classes are offered in Spanish and English at community sites throughout Santa Ana.



HiSET / GED PREP

Prepares students for the HiSET and GED High School Equivalency Exams.

- Exams are offered in English and Spanish
- Online and in-person classes available
- Students can earn their equivalency certificate in as little as four months!







High School Diploma (HSD)

Offered online and in-person, students need to complete 160 credits to earn their high school diploma.

Online classes are 8-weeks long and students are required to complete one module per week.

With in-person classes, **students complete coursework at their own pace**. Classes are held at Centennial Education Center and Santa Ana College.




