





### **GENDER BREAKDOWN OF STUDENTS**







#### Transfer

- Increase student transfer rates by 2%
- Increase campus-wide awareness of AD-Ts through marketing and SAC Catalog

#### **Successful Enrollment: Early Decision Initiative**

- 75% of high school seniors participating in SAC's "Early Decision" initiative will enroll and matriculate in the upcoming fall semester.
  - Progress: 88% of the Early Decision students remained enrolled past census in fall 2024.

#### California Adult Education Program (CAEP) Integration

- Track engagement opportunities for credit faculty to learn about noncredit programs
- Track increase articulation agreements established to support noncredit to credit transition.
  - Progress: Credit and Noncredit managers engaged in a planning discussions to strengthen the partnership.

#### **Zero Textbook Cost to Degree**

- Identify Zero Textbook Cost pathways for the ZTC Program California Grants
  - Progress: 11 ZTC pathways established in the areas of American sign Language, Paralegal,
     Public Fire Services, Retail management, Caregiver, Entrepreneurship & Innovation, HVAC-R, International Business, Library Tech, and Math.

#### 4. ENSURE LEARNING

#### Completed Transfer Level Math & English

- Increase the current completion rate of Transfer Level Math and English from 9% to 25% by end of 2026.
  - Progress: Math and English departments are utilizing AB7O5 funds to close equity gaps and increase successful completion rates in Math and English transfer level courses.

#### Student Equity and Achievement Program (SEAP)

- Increase capacity for positions that are solely dedicated to GP and SEAP work.
  - Progress: Guided Pathways Steering Committee was established; SEAP expanded its team to include Equity Goal Facilitators (5 Faculty members).





#### 4. ENSURE LEARNING

#### **Strong Workforce Program (SWP)**

- Review highest priority Career Education programs to identify needed equipment and curriculum updates.
- High priority programs leverage SWP funding to work with regional employers to update curriculum and purchase needed equipment.
- All Continuing Education programs complete the process of reviewing curriculum and equipment to ensure labor market relevance.

#### Fall Food Pantry Highlights:

- 1. Food Pantry Usage. Achieved 9,000 total visits to the Food Pantry in Fall 2024, reflecting a 17% increase compared to Fall 2023, demonstrating continued growth in supporting students' food security needs.
- 2. Holiday Initiative Success. Supported 468 families by distributing Northgate Markets gift cards, turkeys, and food boxes, ensuring students and their families had access to essential holiday meals and resources.


