

Chapman Transfer Agreement Guarantee (C-TAG)

Articulation Agreement with Santa Ana College

The following Chapman University major preparation courses are required to be completed at SAC and/or SCC for direct admission into the Liberal Studies major with the Elementary Education minor. All required courses must have a minimum grade of C or higher.

Completion of Chapman University General Education (GE) Requirements:

- a) Students who have full California State University-General Education Breadth (CSU-GE Breadth) or Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) certification or an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) will be able to satisfy the majority of the GE requirements for Chapman University. Students will still be held to the Minor requirements.
- b) Foreign Language General Education requirement: In order to meet this requirement students must complete the 3rd semester of college level Foreign Language. However, students may take their foreign language requirement as part of the IGETC or CSU GE Breadth or through their ADT. Note: Completing foreign language prior to transfer is not an admission requirement but is highly recommended.
- c) Students need not complete the full certification at the time of application but if doing so, CSU GE Breadth or IGETC courses or the ADT must be completed prior to starting classes at Chapman University.

Steps for Interested Students:

- 1) Go to www.sac.edu/ctag and complete interest form.
- 2) Attend a C-TAG Information Session (see websites for dates). All students who complete the interest form will be invited to participate in an Information Session.
- 3) Meet with a Counselor from the Center for Teacher Education (CFTE, or other Counselor) to review requirements and create a comprehensive education plan.
- 4) Once Steps #1-3 are complete, the CFTE will help schedule an appointment with the Chapman University Admissions Advisor to discuss application process and financial aid.
- 5) Submit application to Chapman University before the priority deadlines.
- 6) Complete and submit a FAFSA/CA Dream Act application before the priority deadline.

Graduation Requirements

The requirements for graduation at Chapman are commensurate with the school's liberal arts philosophy. The program of studies is designed to ensure a breadth of subject matter in the liberal arts as well as a depth in the preparation in the major field. A student's curriculum includes preparatory courses, the General Education program, major requirements and free electives and must meet the following requirements:

- A minimum of 120 credits.
- A minimum of 42 credits earned in upper-division coursework.
- A minimum of 48 credits earned at Chapman, 30 of which must be upper-division, with 15 of those 30 upper-division credits in the student's major.
- Completion of all general education requirements.
- A maximum of 24 credits transferred after matriculation.
- A 2.000 Chapman cumulative GPA and a 2.000 cumulative GPA for all work leading to the degree, including transfer work.
- A 2.000 GPA for all major coursework and all upper-division major coursework.
- Resolution of all "NR", "I", "TI" and "SP" notations.
- For a Bachelor of Arts Degree, a minimum of 60 credits outside of the discipline of the major.

All transfer credit applied toward the degree must be evaluated and approved by the Office of the University Registrar. In addition, transfer work going toward the student's major or minor may require departmental approval. No transfer work with grades earned below "C-" will be accepted toward meeting graduation requirements, but all earned grades will be counted in the student's overall cumulative grade-point average.

Once students are enrolled at Chapman University, it is strongly recommended that, prior to taking courses elsewhere, students check the online transfer articulation database to determine whether the courses are transferable to Chapman University. Students should check with the Office of the University Registrar if they have any questions regarding whether a course at another institution will transfer to Chapman.

Students transferring courses after matriculation also need to check that they are not exceeding credit load limits for the semester (See [Course Load](#) in Academic Policies and Procedures).
