





CSUF, SAC and SAUSD Join Forces for Higher Education Providing Priority Access to College for Santa Ana Students

Fullerton | Friday, May 6, 2011—Officials of Santa Ana College (SAC) and the Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) join forces today with California State University, Fullerton (CSUF) to create Santa Ana *Adelante!*, an innovative program to see a college diploma in every Santa Ana home by 2020.

Santa Ana Adelante! will provide local students with a seamless pipeline from middle school through high school to college and university. The program offers qualifying SAUSD students an opportunity to be first in line on the path to college, and provides plenty of concrete assistance and expert guidance along the way.

The hour-long event, featuring public school student and parent speakers, will conclude with Santa Ana Unified School District Superintendent Jane A. Russo, Santa Ana College President Erlinda J. Martinez and California State University, Fullerton's President Milton A. Gordon completing a formal signing ceremony inaugurating the compact.

"By guaranteeing college and university admission to all qualified students, Santa Ana Adelante! aims to put as many students as possible first in line on the path to a college degree," said CSUF President Milton A. Gordon. "Together with Santa Ana College and the Santa Ana Unified School District, we are taking a giant step forward in accessibility."

"Santa Ana Adelante! will deliver on the promise of higher education for local high school students in the Santa Ana Unified School District," said SAC President Erlinda Martinez. "Our students can only benefit from the creative collaboration of the partnering institutions, and I am certain many will make the most of this wonderful new opportunity."

"This is a tremendous opportunity for the students of Santa Ana Unified School District," noted SAUSD Superintendent Jane Russo. "By establishing a direct pathway for students from our middle schools to college, Santa Ana *Adelante!* will benefit our students, their families, and the many companies and industries in Southern California whose future depends on continued access to a well-educated workforce."

The new program guarantees participating students priority registration at Santa Ana College and guaranteed transfers to attend CSUF, where they will complete their bachelor's degree. The first group of SAUSD students to benefit from Santa Ana *Adelante!* will be the graduating seniors from the Class of 2011. They will enter SAC this fall and transfer to CSUF in 2013 or 2014, depending on their ability to enroll in required transfer classes at SAC.

Beginning in fall 2011, Santa Ana *Adelante!* will provide a variety of educational benefits and services to participating SAUSD graduates. The program's benefits include:

- Early college and career planning beginning in the 6th grade for both parents and students in the SAUSD.
- All 6th-grade parents and students will sign the "I'm Going to College" pledge.
- Continued and coordinated early outreach efforts and college-bound activities for both parents and students, 9th through 12th grade, led by Achieving College, a network of high school counselors and outreach staff from SAC and CSUF.

- CSUF will guarantee college admission to all SAUSD students who complete all transfer requirements at SAC and successfully meet CSUF admissions standards.
- SAUSD seniors will receive priority registration to SAC for the fall semester prior to graduating from high school.
- The city of Santa Ana will promote the Santa Ana Futures scholarship as part of its annual employee payroll deduction program, providing continuing financial support.
- All SAUSD students attending SAC will receive individual assistance to ensure they access all available financial assistance while at SAC.

Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) educates approximately 58,000 students at 61 dynamic school sites throughout the Santa Ana community. The K-12 school district is the largest in Orange County and the second largest employer in Santa Ana, with approximately 4,500 educators and staff members. The school district boasts 28 California Distinguished Schools, five National Blue Ribbon Schools, and two 2011 National Blue Ribbon nominees. In addition, Saddleback High, Valley High and Santa Ana High School were named as three of the most improved high schools in Orange County for students passing the California High School Exit Exam.
