ARTICULATION OFFICER REPORT INFORMATION

1. Paula provided the council with a report from the state academic senate on reciprocity of courses as they pertain to AA-T and AS-T degrees. Paula presented information on what we currently do with regard to reciprocity of coursework from other institutions and recommended changes to address specifically, transfer degrees. C&I members were provided with a draft of recommended changes and were requested to inform faculty and bring back any feedback to the next meeting. A vote regarding the recommended changes will take place at that time.

2. Regarding C-ID course approvals. The Council was reminded that the last date for a first reading of course changes will be on November 18th.
