B. Monica Porter reported to the Council members briefly about the Repeatability Restrictions for Experimental/Special Topics Courses. She will provide more details at the next meeting.

C. Kim Henry announced to the Council members that by Fall 2014, all courses offered at C.E.C will be launched in the CurricUNET.

D. Kathy Patterson reported to the Council members that 74 % of all TAP honors certified transfer students got into UCLA with a GPA range of 3 .1 to 4.0. Students had to complete honors program, have at least a 3.1 cumulative GPA, and be certified by Kathy Patterson and counselor Angela Brown. Of non-honors applicants, 28% were admitted. Honors students also had the opportunity to declare a second major as long as it was different (for example, not Economics and

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Business Economics) and the students completed prep work for both. Almost 2/3 of all applicants to UCLA had a 3.5 or higher GPA.
