V. Action Items:

A. General Education New Plan A Proposal

M. Grant stated that Resolution S2024.11 Adopt Recommended Revised GE Plan A went through first read at the May 14th Academic Senate Meeting.

After brief discussion, a motion was made to approve the new name for the General Education Requirements, including the courses listed in the document with the following corrections: the removal of Communication Studies 152 and Mathematics 145, as well as the Philosophy of Santa Ana College General Education document.

It was recommended that the general education requirements be reviewed every 4 years.

VI. CIC Chair's Report

A. META – MAVERICK

M. Grant stated that faculty may continue to update CORs and programs, but they should remain in draft mode. She also mentioned that courses and programs currently under in-review status will be reverted to draft status. This is necessary to ensure a smooth transition from our current META version to the updated Maverick version. The transition is scheduled for the week of June 10th, and Maverick will be accessible starting the week of June 17th.

- M. Grant shared that a new cross-listing feature will be available. With this feature, the primary course holder will need to be identified. Once the courses are linked, any updates made to a cross-listing course during the proposal process will automatically update the link course, and discipline faculty members will be notified of the changes. Additionally, the "same as" wording will be automatically included in the COR and should no longer be included in the course description.
- M. Grant mentioned that training sessions for Canvas courses and the new META format will be offered during Professional Development week. The decision on whether these sessions will be conducted separately or together is still under discussion.
- M. Grant requested feedback on the prerequisite statement. She also mentioned that currently, Colleague does not recognize a grade of P as meeting enrollment conditions; however, ITS is in discussions with Ellucian to find a possible solution.

Discussion ensued.

M. Grant reported that the Work Experience Education (WEE) forms have been updated and distributed to the faculty. She also mentioned that the Administrative Regulations (ARs) related to WEE have been revised and submitted the Academic Senate for their review. Once reviewed by the Academic Senate, they will submit the Ars for approval through the college's process.

M. Grant mentioned that non-Career Education (CE) faculty interested in creating a WEE course should use the 4932.00 TOP code. She explained that this TOP code recommendation was made by the California Internship & Work Experience Association (CIWEA), supported by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) and the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC).

VII. Discussion

A. Curriculum Canvas Course

M. Grant shared that the Canvas shells will be updated over the summer.

B. Apprenticeship Grant

M. Grant gave a shout-out to the various departments that received Apprenticeship grants.

VIII. Other

M. Grant notified the committee that Colleague does not retain program titles after modifications. Consequently, a student might obtain a certificate bearing a different title form what is listed in their catalog year. To address this challenge, a new program code must be generated for updated programs. Additionally, she proposed adding a checkbox in META for faculty to indicate significant changes made to modified programs.

M. Grant shared that the Academic Senate had its initial review of Resolution S2024.10, which pertains to the adoption of the Course Enrollment Maximum (CEM) Process. She also noted that plans to email department chairs, detailing potential tasks for courses with current enrollment caps using the RG540 report. Additionally, she highlighted that CEM proposals will be integrated into Maverick, operating similarly to materials-only proposals.

M. Grant updated the committee about the upcoming Curriculum Institute, slated to run from July 10 through July 13. The event will take place in Pasadena, offering a hybrid format for participation. Those interested in attending are encouraged to apply for Professional Development funds.

M. Grant expressed gratitude to committee members for their dedicated hours of service. She also highlighted ongoing discussions regarding a potential restructuring of CIC, including the consideration of forming a separate Technical Committee group distinct from CIC membership.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:33 p.m.
