



Federally-funded programs account for $\approx 36\%$ of SAC funding and $\approx 45\%$ of CEC funding.*

One Big Beautiful Bill Act (OBBBA) Changes to Financial Aid

OBBBA is established federal law

Full-time status remains at 24 credits per year

- House recommended 30 credits per year but the Senate and President did not approve.

Earnings Threshold Test

- Undergraduate programs whose graduates earn less than high school-only workers are not eligible for federal student loans, starting July 1, 2026
- Restriction does not apply to grants or workstudy
- Program ineligibility based on graduates' median earnings falling below thresholds for 2 years in a 3-year span
- Institutions can reapply for program eligibility after at least two years of ineligibility
- Guidance will be forthcoming from the U.S. Department of Education.



One Big Beautiful Bill Act (OBBBA) Changes to Financial Aid (cont.)

OBBBA is established federal law

Expansion of **Pell** to cover short-term workforce training programs

- Programs must be accredited
- 8-15 weeks long with 150-600 hours of training
- Have a 70% completion and job placement rate
- Be operating for at least 1 year
- Deliver earnings that at least exceed costs to students
- Be state-verified as aligned with in-demand, high-wage jobs, and lead to recognized credential or job readiness

Changes to Repayment Terms for Student Loans

- Hardship and unemployment deferments end for new loans after July 1, 2026
- Forbearance (i.e., lower payments) reduced to 9-months within a 2-year window



President's Requested Budget FY 2026 (PRB) Proposed Changes to Financial Aid

PRB Changes are Proposed

Proposed reductions to federal financial aid:

- Eliminate funding for the Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)
- Reduce workstudy by 74.5%
- Reduce maximum Pell award from \$7,400 to \$5,710 (cut of \$1,685)

SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)

OBBBA Changes to SNAP

Federal contribution to CalFresh reduced from 50% to 25%.

Federal contribution decreases further if state doesn't improve 7% error rate.*

*error rate refers to determination of eligibility and calculation of benefits.

Only citizens, nationals and permanent residents are eligible; refugees and asylum seekers are no longer eligible.

Enforce work/volunteer requirement of 20 hours/week.

Restrict flexibility for states to waive requirement.

Remove exemption for veterans, homeless, and youth that have aged out of foster care.

QUESTION	ANSWER
<p>What should I do if an Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agent or Customs and Border Protection (CBP) agent is on campus?</p>	<p>1. Stay Calm: Immediate compliance is not required. Santa Ana College (SAC) has established administrative procedures and policies to follow. Take your time while working through these steps, and do not panic or feel rushed.</p> <p>2. Direct Agents to SAC Campus Safety: Inform the officers that you are not obstructing their process, but that you must refer them to the proper channels for guidance and assistance. Direct the officer to contact SAC Campus Safety at their 24/7 line: (714) 564-6330. You may provide initial details of the ICE or CBP agent's request to SAC Campus Safety.</p> <p>3. Know that Campus Safety Will Document: SAC Campus Safety will notify the President's Office and share documentation of immigration enforcement activities that occur on campus.</p>




